Church Elects New Pastor

Reverend Samuel Monte led the worship service on Sunday, July 23, as a candidate for the solo pastor position available at Condit. After the service a congregational meeting, led by Pastor Wayne Morrison, was held. There was a question/answer period where members could make inquiries to Rev. Monte. Scioto Valley Presbytery representative, Natalie Alter, then escorted Rev. Monte from the sanctuary while a written ballot election led by Pastor Wayne and Session Clerk, Chip Welch, was conducted. Chip announced the vote was in the affirmative that Rev. Monte was approved to serve as pastor of Condit. Rev. Monte returned to the sanctuary and accepted the call to begin leading at the beginning of September.

The process of searching for a new minister has been a lengthy process. The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) was formed to perform the search. The group of five (Marianne Westbrook, Grant Bartlett, Carmie Joseph, Doreen Bartlett and Mick Sheets) prepared a Mission Information Form (MIF), entered it into the Presbyterian Call System, reviewed matched Pastor Information Forms (PIF), and agreed upon potential candidates to contact and interview. They discovered Samuel Monte in late May. After three interviews and hearing Rev. Monte preach in a neutral pulpit the PNC felt the need to meet him face to face. After discussion it was agreed to extend to him a call to be our potential pastor, which he accepted and therefore came to Condit on Sunday to lead worship.

Rev. Samuel Monte is currently serving a yoked congregation in northern Ohio. He graduated with a degree in English from Kent State University in 2008, earned a Master of Divinity from the Pittsburgh Theological Seminary in 2012. He has been serving in small rural churches since his ordination in 2012. Highly recommended by the Presbytery, he is passionate about his preaching and outreach to the community. In addition to serving as minister he is active in the church projects of grab and go meals, gift wrapping at Christmas and supporting teacher's needs for supplies.

In his free time Rev. Monte enjoys spending time with his family. He is engaged to Jules and has 6 children- Xavier, Elijah, Martha, Odessa, Julian and Nemo. They own a Saint Bernard named Barker Mayfield, so of course, are Cleveland Brown fans as well as Buckeye fans! We look forward to welcoming them all permanently in September. Many thanks to the PNC for their dedicated, time consuming efforts in finding a match for our congregation.

Getting to Know You.....

Jacobus ties to charter members

When Cornelius H. Jacobus wrote out his will on Feb. 15, 1832 he and his wife Abigail Gould Jacobus knew they might never see five of their children again. John C., Joseph, Moses, Mercy and Mariah with their families were leaving Caldwell Township, Essex County, New Jersey and going, or had already gone, to start new lives in what would become Trenton Township, Delaware County, Ohio.

Three from this family would be charter members of Trenton Presbyterian Church, the forerunner of present-day Condit Presbyterian Church. They were **Mercy Jacobus Wheaton**, wife of Squire Wheaton who was also a charter member along with their daughter Sarah; **Mariah Jacobus Condit**, wife of Alvin P. Condit, another charter member, and **Sarah Gould Jacobus**, wife of John C. Jacobus.

It is Sarah Gould Jacobus that ties past to present for Condit members George Justice and Donna Mucci and the four Saunders brothers - Gary, Bruce, Ray and Dean - featured in last month's newsletter.


Debbie Layton Saunders, Gary's wife, remembered being given a charter member ribbon at a church celebration years ago but neither she nor Gary knew how they were connected to those 20 people who signed the charter on Oct. 15, 1836. Then Gary mentioned his grandparents who had lived east of the church on Hartford Road - George E. and Agnes Faye Jacobus Saunders - **Jacobus**, a name on the charter member list.

George E. Saunders, called Eddie, probably because his father was George, and Agnes Faye Jacobus were married Dec. 9, 1909 by the Rev. John Glenn, pastor of Trenton Presbyterian Church.

The parents of Agnes were William Jacobus and Jennie Curry. In his will of 1921 William Jacobus bequeathed to his daughter Agnes the McNeely farm containing 84 acres located in Trenton Township.



Many children were born to Agnes Faye and George E. Saunders including Raymond, father of the four Saunders brothers mentioned earlier, and Dorothy Saunders Justice, mother of Condit members George Justice and Donna Mucci.






Dorothy Saunders Justice

The father of William Jacobus was George Jacobus who married Harriet Miller in Feb. 17, 1844 in Delaware County, OH. Born in 1818 in New Jersey, he was the son of John C. Jacobus and his wife Sarah Gould Jacobus, who joined the Trenton Presbyterian Church as a charter member October 15, 1836. *Continued on page 6*

The 1966 Sunbury Sesquicentennial history says most of the first church meetings were held in the Ogden log school house south of the intersection of present day Rt. 605 and Route 37. The first church was built in 1838, shown on the 1849 Delaware County map on present Route 37 and just west of Route 605, perhaps near the old tombstones still standing there.

The fragment of that 1849 Trenton Township map shown here starts around the center of the township and follows Hartford Road to the east border. With a little magnification it is easy to see the Jacobus, Condit and Wheaton properties near each other. The five siblings from New Jersey were never far apart in life and, except for Mariah Jacobus and Alvin Condit who went to Iowa in later years, the husbands and wives and many members of their families remain close in Trenton Township Cemetery.

Still today there are six properties in the Jacobus name in eastern Delaware County, probably descendants of those from New Jersey who tamed the land and started the church we call Condit Presbyterian. There must be many more like the Saunders and Justices married into other families, living under other names, who are also descended from Condit's founders.

2023 Duncan's Run Bicycle Patch Ride a Success



Condit served 162 bike riders on July 8th during the Harlem Township Heritage, Inc. (HTH) yearly bike ride fundraiser. The ride originated in 2011 as a family event and has evolved into a larger course for more serious riders. Participants park and register at John Beltz Retreat Center and complete a course of 30, 60 or 80 miles. The full course offers two rest stops and one water stop. Condit Presbyterian Church provides the east side yard as a rest stop, allowing HTH a site to offer water, snacks and restrooms for the participants. The second rest stop is Branstool Orchards in Utica. At the conclusion of the ride, bikers return to the retreat center where lunch is served. This year the luncheon was catered by The Glass Rooster Cannery.



Each year a unique patch is included in the registration fee for the first 100 registered riders. The 2023 patch featured Polly Horn riding the high-wheeler in the mid 1950's. (The full photo was included in the feature article written about Polly by Jennie Kavage in the June 2023 Condit Courier.)

HTH is a group dedicated to preserving the heritage/history of Harlem Township and to promoting a sense of community by hosting a variety of events. One activity is held each month. Upcoming events are:
