Westbrook Inducted into Men of Condit

Bob Westbrook was recognized for his outstanding contributions to the church on Sunday, June 18. The "Men of Condit" tradition began approximately 40 years ago with Rev. Carol Weiss suggesting that men of Condit be acknowledged for making special contributions to the church. Over the years their efforts have been recognized by awarding them a navy blue cap bearing the seal of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The tradition continues today and Bob is the most recent inductee into the group.

Bob and wife Marianne joined Condit in 2019. Bob was quickly put to work. He has served three terms as trustee helping with church upkeep and maintenance. He has also done some individual woodworking and handyman projects around the church. Having trained with Lyle Melick on the audio/visual system, Bob



operates the sound/screens each Sunday, allowing our services to be viewed LIVE online. His most recent undertaking is heading the upstairs bathroom renovation project which will result in an Americans with Disabilities Act (A.D.A.) compliant restroom. *Article continued on page 7*



All of them kept their appointments and one more walked-in. At the end of the day, we had collected 30 pints to save 90 lives. The Red Cross Team was very efficient so we were all done by 6:15 which was almost an hour earlier than usual.

Getting to Know You.... the Saunders brothers

What began as a simple story about benches refinished turned out to be a bigger story of good memories and a family history that stretches back to Condit's founding.

About the time of the recent clean-up day Trustee George Justice called his cousin Dean Saunders and asked him if he would refinish the wooden benches that sit above the patio outside the Fellowship Hall. Dean said "sure" and called up his brother Gary to help load them for transport to his home workshop.

The benches had been sitting out in the weather a long time. A plaque on one says it was given in memory of Gerry and Wayne Reppart - parents of Bonnie Caudill, church organist for many years; grandparents of Dennis and Chris, and Jim Caudill's in-laws. "Gerry was my mom's best friend," Gary Saunders recalls.

Raymond and Jane Saunders were parents of the four Saunders brothers who were part of the Sunday School classes and Youth Fellowship at Condit during their growing up years. Raymond was a Condit Church kid himself, growing up on the Saunders farm just a short way east on Hartford Road. When he went off to navy training in Chicago he met a girl named Jane Benson at a USO dance. She captured his heart and when his navy days were done she left Chicago's southside and came with him to the farm as his wife.

Gary was born and then Bruce while they lived at the farm but Raymond had painful back problems. When the doctor told him he could farm no longer he moved to Sunbury where sons Ray and Dean were born. He got a job with North American Rockwell and then GE in Worthington until he retired. In retirement Jane and Raymond along with fellow church members Fishers, Repparts, Buxtons and others formed a camping club. They were often off on weekend getaways; sometimes just by the pond at Bill and Margaret Fisher's. Gary remembers church services

there in the summer. Later there would be an occasional summer church service at The Woods at the Nettelhorst farm on Fredricks Road. The Saunders lived in Florida for 13 years after their retirement. A trailer at The Woods became their summer home and they celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary there.

The brothers grew up and went off to college - Gary and Bruce to Wilmington College while Ray and Dean stayed in Columbus. Gary majored in political science and history but went to work for Nestles in Sunbury and then Marysville in research and development. He is married to his hometown sweetheart, Debbie Layton. Their children Jennifer, Amanda and Eric grew up as Condit kids. There are seven grandchildren.

Bruce went into education and stayed in the Wilmington area after college teaching and becoming an elementary school principal. He has also headed a small private school in Wilmington and worked in IT for the area schools. Bruce is very involved with his Presbyterian Church and has served as Moderator of the Presbytery. He and his wife, Ann, have three children.

After Ohio State Ray worked in the restaurant and hospitality business all his life. For a time he was in Florida but now lives in Columbus. Before he retired he was working at the exclusive Capital Club downtown.

When Gary plays golf in Croton he gives a nod to the past as he goes by the church and what he calls "my grandmother's farm," where his cousin Kevin Justice now lives.

About this time in my conversation with Gary, Debbie mentioned they were given "Charter Member" ribbons to wear at the last big church anniversary. That will be Part II of this article and include the Justices and Muccis, as well. The connection is Agnes Faye Jacobus Saunders, grandmother of them all.


